My Dear Loved Ones:

God says in Psalm 91:6 - "Nor of the pestilence that walks in darkness, / Nor of the destruction that lays waste at noonday."

So, our greatest fear should be fear. We ought to be afraid of being afraid. Or as President Franklin Delano Roosevelt said, "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself." Why? Because God hasn't forgotten to be gracious, and gives light and songs in the night.

Broad daylight can bring it's dangers, but since God can so protect us, provide for us, guide us, guard us and govern us at night, don't you think that He can do just as well at protecting us in the day from all the things that we do see with our eyes? He can loved ones.

He says in 2 Corinthians, that we must not look at the things that are seen, but at the things that are unseen, for the things that are seen by our eyes are merely temporary, but the things that are unseen are eternal.
