

My Dear Loved Ones:

God says in Psalm 91:15 - "He shall call upon Me, and I will answer him; / I will be with him in trouble; / I will deliver him and honor him."

This is the LORD speaking to us and promising certain things to us here in this section of the psalm. If you notice in this verse, like the previous verse, that there are responsibilities on our part, and when we do our responsibility, God promises to do a responsibility for us. It's a type of promise, but it's conditional upon our doing our part.

Our part is to run to the LORD in prayer. Call on God. And this prayer is not just happening at one point only once a week, or even once a day. The thought is that we are to be running to Him and calling upon Him in prayer numerous times a day, and continually going to Him. Jesus gave the story of a woman who continually went to an unjust judge, and kept pestering him about her case. The unjust judge eventually said to himself, "I'm going to take care of this woman's case just because she pesters me!" Jesus' point is how much more would the great, good God answer us if we continually run to Him in prayer?! Keep in mind that He alone is the Helper; we are the helpless. We need Him every hour.

But God has a conditional promise if we keep running to Him in prayer. He promises: 1) to answer us, 2) to be with us in trouble, 3) to deliver us, and 4) honor us. Stop and think of each one of those promises that God will perform if we continually humble ourselves and give Him all of our burdens. He not only will answer our prayer (maybe not the way we ever thought He would), but He also will be with us through the difficulty to deliver us, and will honor us because we have honored him with our lives through it all.

Through the Covid-19, we must be taking God as His Word. Run to Him in prayer, and then claim these promises to God in prayer as you speak with Him.
